2013-2014 YEAR IN REVIEW

My year as President has been an enjoyable, illuminating, and gratifying experience. I have been overwhelmed by the support provided by the Board of Directors and other members of the Association in giving of their time and effort on behalf of the NYIPLA to serve the intellectual property law profession. The innovation and expansion of programs during the year has been particularly pleasing, leading to growth of the NYIPLA in membership and services and resulting in a blockbuster year. The Association is only at the beginning of a continuous success in implementing a well thought-out strategic plan.

I would be remiss if I did not extend my thanks to Robin Rolfe Resources, Inc. for their excellent service and support throughout the year, with particular applause due Robin Rolfe, Feikje Van Rein, and Lisa Lu.

Strategic Plan

During the year, the Board of Directors developed and passed a three-year strategic plan as a guiding platform to provide service and education for the intellectual property law profession. Educational programs were presented in the New York metropolitan area, as well as upstate New York and Long Island. Additionally, the NYIPLA became more involved in the legislative process in Washington D.C. in regard to proposed modifications in the law and implementation of the America Invents Act (AIA). The Association was very active in preparing and filing amicus briefs to provide guidance for the federal judiciary. Activity in the NYIPLA is not limited to the United States as the Association continues to cooperate with European and Far East patent authorities. The strategic plan provided a jump start to the expanded activities of the Association and was instrumental in developing a number of new initiatives.

NYIPLA Presidents' Forums

One major new program that was implemented during the year is the NYIPLA Presidents' Forum. It involves a series of high-level roundtable discussions including intellectual property lawyers in corporate and private practice, representatives of various business entities involved in pertinent aspects of intellectual property law, and members of the federal judiciary and the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Issues were discussed for several hours and the results were publicized. The first forum in October 2013 was entitled, "What to Do About NPEs: Do We Risk Throwing the Baby Out With the Bathwater?"; the second forum held in February 2014 addressed proposed patent legislation pending in Congress. Both forums and the program as a whole were well received and additional forums are planned for the coming year.

Legislative Involvement

On an expedited basis to provide advice and guidance, the Association took upon itself this past year to prepare and submit letters to members of Congress and other interested parties relating to legislation proposed to supplement the previously passed AIA and to address other perceived necessary changes in the patent laws.

Judicial Support

During the year the Association demonstrated its support for the pilot program in place for educating federal judges to facilitate their handling of patent litigation. We continue to reach out to those judges who are interested and willing to expand their ability to preside over patent cases. Numerous CLE programs during the year were presented to support the process and appear to have been well received by the federal judiciary. Another program that is being developed in this respect involves cooperation with the Federal Judicial Center to provide an annual educational program for selected judges to aid in managing patent litigation. Part of the funding for this program will be provided by a newly formed NYIPLA Educational Foundation, whereby the Association will provide funds for the Federal Judicial Center program and other educational programs to support the education of judges regarding intellectual property law as part of the strategic plan of the Association. Past President Tom Meloro is to be thanked for his efforts to form the Foundation.

Annual Dinner in Honor of the Federal Judiciary

I am pleased to report that our 92nd Annual Dinner in Honor of the Federal Judiciary was a great success. The number of attendees, as well as the number of judges, significantly increased, evidencing growth of the membership in the Association as well as recognition of the NYIPLA in New York and beyond. The program for the dinner included a well-deserved public service award presented to Judge Gregory M. Sleet, Chief Judge of the U.S. District Court for the District of Delaware. We were honored to present the award to Judge Sleet and point out his exemplary public service contributions over the years and his close geographic ties with the Association. We were also particularly pleased to have as our dinner speaker Kenneth A. Starr, former federal judge, special prosecutor, practicing appellate specialist, professor of law, and current President of Baylor University. It was a great honor to have Ken Starr as our speaker, and we are gratified that he was so well received at the dinner. I would be remiss if I did not mention the excellent Day of the Dinner Luncheon CLE Program: “Key Developments in the Evolving Law of Remedies in Patent Infringement Cases.” The program included a diverse and excellent group of participants including judges, U.S. Patent and Trademark Office representatives, and skilled practitioners.

NYIPLA Cooperative CLE Programs

For the 30th consecutive year, the Association cooperated with the Connecticut, New Jersey, and Philadelphia IP law associations to conduct the Joint Patent Practice (JPP) CLE Seminar in April 2014. This joint, one-day program continues to draw numerous attendees and successfully provide a timely educational opportunity in New York City for intellectual property practitioners. In March 2014, I was pleased to participate along with others from the NYIPLA in cooperation with the Federal Circuit Bar Association in its Bench and Bar Program entitled, "Patent Litigation in New York Courts: A View from the Bench." This event was one of a series of Federal Circuit Bar events held throughout the country. It was well attended and happily co-sponsored by the NYIPLA. We were also pleased to participate in the March 2014 Licensing Executives Society of the United States and Canada mid-year meeting in New York City and to join in providing education concerning patent litigation for the LES attendees. Plans are also underway for a joint program with Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in Troy, New York, to inform and educate students, professors, judges, and the bar in that region regarding pertinent technology and intellectual property law issues. We also co-sponsored an AIA trial proceedings roundtable event with the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. In May 2014, we participated in World IP Day with a program entitled, "Movies a Global Passion." Also in May 2014 we joined with the Long Island Forum for Technology and other technological organizations on Long Island to host a joint program entitled, "A Toolkit of Practical and Essential IP Advice for Startups." It is clear that our joint educational efforts throughout the year are quite significant and hopefully provide a positive impact on the profession. It is with the enthusiasm and participation of the Association committees, officers, and members of the Board that we are able to provide such a diverse and comprehensive service. There is no doubt that the strategic plan of the Association is being pursued in regard to cooperation with fellow bar associations in New York and other geographic areas to widen the scope and recognition of the Association and to serve a wider range of the community. In return, it is expected that growth of the Association will follow as it has for the benefit of all.

NYIPLA Independent CLE Programs

The variety of independent CLE programs made available by the Association was also quite comprehensive. In May 2013, a Young Lawyers Roundtable was held entitled, "Expert Depositions in Intellectual Property Litigation." In June 2013, a full-day symposium was held entitled, "Patent Law Developments in China." A program entitled, "Oh the Places You'll Go! Diverse Careers in IP Law and Strategies for Achieving Success" and a CLE seminar on hot topics in trademarks, advertising, copyrights, and design patents took place in July 2013. In September 2013, another Young Lawyers Roundtable was held entitled, "Legal Writing," as well as a CLE program entitled, "Intellectual Property Law Considerations for Software and Mobile Apps." In October 2013, we presented the CLE program entitled, "Life as a Young IP Associate – Managing the Non-Legal Aspects of Your

Practice.” In November 2013, a CLE program was presented entitled, “Understanding Recent Changes in Patent Law and Their Effect on Litigation.”

Another CLE program was also held in November 2013 entitled, “Patent Litigation from the Law Clerks’ Perspective – Insights on New Patent Rules and Successful Litigation Strategies.” In December 2013, we provided an amicus brief discussion entitled, “Fee Shifting in Patent Litigation” and a patent litigation program entitled, “Patent Litigation: Managing Modern IP Litigation Before the Federal Courts, PTO and ITC.” Also in December 2013, we were pleased to have Judge Kathleen O’Malley of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit provide a review from the bench. In January 2014, we held our annual one-day patent CLE seminar at the Princeton Club in New York City, which was well attended and included representatives from the federal government, the federal courts, and leading practitioners. In February 2014, we held another Young Lawyers Roundtable directed to oral argument, and expanded our programming by providing a Webinar entitled, “What Every NY Attorney Should Know About California Privacy Law – But Is Afraid to Ask!” In April 2014, our CLE presentation included a program entitled, “Diverse Careers in IP Law and Strategies for Achieving Success.”

Annual Meeting and Awards Dinner

Our Annual Meeting held on May 20, 2014 at the Princeton Club in New York City was a successful conclusion to an extraordinary year for the NYIPLA. The day began with an innovative CLE luncheon program that included interactive participation with the audience in an enjoyable and relaxing environment. NYIPLA committee meetings were held along with the annual meeting itself. The dinner that followed was well attended, as were the events during the day, and we particularly enjoyed the remarks of Judge Richard J. Sullivan, of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York. We also thank Judge Roslynn Mauskopf, of the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York, for presenting the Honorable William C. Conner Writing Competition Awards. We also were pleased to again present the Inventor of the Year Awards and the Honorable Giles Rich Diversity Scholarship Award to very deserving recipients.

Award Recipients at the 2014 Annual Meeting



Inventors of the Year Award

Dr. Michel Sadelain and Dr. Renier Brentjens were recognized for their numerous disclosures relating to the design of chimeric antigen receptors, or CARs. The winning inventions take a patient's own T-cells and engineer them to recognize a protein that appears on the surface of cancer cells. The modified T-cells are then infused back into the patient's blood stream so they can launch a precise immunologic attack against the cancer. A treatment protocol based on these inventions is currently being used to treat adult patients with relapsed B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL) in a Phase 1 study. In a recent article published in *Science Translational Medicine* in March 2013, and updated at the American Society of Hematology annual meeting in December 2013, 10 of 12 patients with relapsed, refractory ALL went into molecular remission after CAR treatment. While more study is needed, it is a truly promising outcome for these patients.

2013 – 2014 Committee Reports

AMICUS BRIEF

Scope of the Committee: To coordinate the activities of the Association relating to preparation and submission of amicus briefs, and to make recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Directors.

The Association has continued its strong history of representing the Intellectual Property community before the courts and government agencies through its Amicus Brief Committee, which coordinates the activities of the Association regarding the preparation and filing of briefs amicus curiae and makes recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Directors.

Since the last Annual Meeting, the Supreme Court has ruled on a number of cases where the Association filed briefs amicus curiae.

In cases examining the relationships among patent law, antitrust law and the misuse doctrine, the Court's ruling in *Bowman v. Monsanto Co.* followed the Association's reasoning that the doctrine of patent exhaustion does not bar an infringement claim based on the purchase of genetically modified soybeans from a grain elevator to replicate a new generation of genetically modified soybeans. In *FTC v. Actavis, Inc.*, although the Court reversed the Eleventh Circuit's ruling and remanded for a rule-of-reason trial, it followed the Association's recommendation and rejected the FTC's request that a "quick look" rule of presumptive illegality should be applied to reverse payment terms in Hatch-Waxman settlements.

In *Association for Molecular Pathology v. Myriad Genetics, Inc.*, the Court accepted the Committee's reasoning that manipulated DNA sequences are patent eligible under 35 U.S.C. § 101, but was not willing to go so far as to hold that composition claims directed to isolated, naturally occurring human DNA sequences are also patent eligible.

This year, the Committee has submitted numerous amicus briefs to the Supreme Court in key patent cases it is considering.

In *Alice Corp. Pty. Ltd. v. CLS Bank International*, which involves the patent eligibility of computer-implemented claims, the Association filed a brief in support of a Writ of Certiorari, which was granted. The Association's brief on the merits supports neither party, but instead lays out helpful factors to assist the Court in fashioning clearer guidelines on the application of Section 101 of the Patent Act. Oral argument in this case was heard on March 31, 2014.

The Association also submitted identical briefs on the merits in *Octane Fitness, LLC v. ICON Health & Fitness, Inc.* and *Highmark Inc. v. Allcare Health Management System, Inc.* In these twin cases, the Court agreed with the Association's argument that the standard used in determining whether a case is "exceptional" under 35 U.S.C. § 285 was too high and should be eased. Accordingly, on April 29, 2014, the Court ruled that "exceptionality" should be determined by a totality of the circumstances test and that appellate review will be based on an abuse of discretion standard and will not proceed *de novo*.

The Committee also prepared an amicus brief in a significant copyright case heard by the Court this term: *American Broadcasting Cos. v. Aereo, Inc.* That case involves the scope of the public performance right under the Copyright Act, which defines a "public performance" to include the public transmission of the copyrighted work. The NYIPLA advocated in its amicus brief that the Second Circuit's interpretation of the "transmit clause" within the definition of the public performance right in the Copyright Act would make such a right meaningless. Second, allowing the Second Circuit's decision to stand precludes

copyright holders from enforcing their rights against free-riders and other copyright infringers operating under the guise of “innovation,” “entrepreneurship,” and “technological advances.” The NYIPLA amicus brief advanced the proposition that parties should not be permitted to use technology to circumvent liability for copyright infringement, essentially “designing around” the Copyright Act.

The Committee wishes to thank all its members for their dedication, attention, and hard work in these several accomplishments over the past year. In addition, the Committee is especially grateful to members of other Association committees – including Copyright, Trademark Law & Practice, Corporate Practice, Patent Litigation and others – who made contributions great and small on a variety of issues under consideration. The Committee extends an open invitation to all NYIPLA members to contribute their ideas and labor to support this vital function of the Association.

The Committee solicited and reviewed entries for the Hon. William C. Conner Writing Competition. We posted the announcement of the competition on the NYIPLA website in November 2013. In December 2013 and January 2014, emails were sent to professors and students at a number of law schools to encourage that the writing competition announcement be posted at the school to ensure the students were aware of the opportunity.

We received 22 submissions, which were divided into two groups. Each committee member reviewed and ranked the submissions in one group. The best submissions were then reviewed and the top three submissions were chosen and sent to the NYIPLA Board for its consideration. Based on the recommendations of the Committee and a further discussion during the April NYIPLA Board meeting, the winner and runner-up were selected by the Board:

1. “Towards a New Model for Social Media Newsgathering: *AFP v. Morel* and Digital Rights in the Age of Citizen Journalism” by Kristen G. Niven (Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law)
2. “Are Registrars the Modern Cybersquatter?: Investigating Contributory Liability under the ACPA” by Jane W. Wise (American University, Washington College of Law)

The committee notified the winners and arranged for the presentations to be made at the Annual Meeting Awards Dinner.

NYS CLE ACCREDITED PROVIDER STATUS

The New York State Continuing Legal Education Board (“NYS CLE Board”) initially certified the New York Intellectual Property Law Association (“NYIPLA”) as an Accredited Provider of continuing legal education (“CLE”) in the State of New York on September 1, 1999. All NYIPLA live CLE courses and programs given from August 1, 1997 up to August 27, 1999 were retroactively approved. As of January 11, 2000, the NYS CLE Board approved our application for non-traditional formats for videotapes. Videotaped CLE courses and programs given from August 1, 1997 were retroactively approved. We received approval of the non-traditional CLE format (DVD) on August 15, 2005.

We submitted our Application for Renewal of Accredited Provider Status to the NYS CLE Board on May 1, 2011. Approval as an Accredited Provider of CLE programs for the period of August 28, 2011 through August 27, 2014 was renewed on October 3, 2011 for the following formats:

- Live classroom, for group participation; and
- Prerecorded video, for self-study.

We continue to provide educational courses that satisfy NYS CLE credits in accordance with NYS Rules, Regulations and Guidelines.

In compliance with the requirements of the NYS CLE Rules, Regulations and Guidelines, we also filed an annual report with the NYS CLE Board on January 2014 covering the 2013 calendar year.

This year the Committee continued the CLE program series in conjunction with the NYIPLA Annual Dinner in Honor of the Federal Judiciary at the Waldorf Astoria New York Hotel on March 28, 2014. Special invitations were sent to the Honored Guests attending the dinner. A distinguished panel, including four federal judges, presented a well-received discussion.

During the program period (May 1, 2013 through April 30, 2014), the NYIPLA has sponsored 15 CLE programs. We continue to price programs reasonably, so as to cover necessary costs. There were five financial aid requests granted in 2013-2014 in the form of five partial scholarships.

EXCELLENT ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES OFFERED BY ROBIN ROLFE RESOURCES, INC.

All of the CLE-related administrative functions continued to be centralized with Robin Rolfe Resources, Inc., with systems and procedures in place to provide continuous, coordinated support. This includes scheduling; communications with the hosting committee’s program chairs, speakers and attendees; preparation and mailing of meeting notices; registration processing; preparation of Certificates of Participation, Course Evaluations and Certificates of Attendance under the direction of the CLE Committee Co-Chairs; logistical planning and coordination; and providing video/DVD program availability. Robin Rolfe Resources also assisted in the preparation of the year-end report to the NYS CLE Board and the accredited provider renewal application and audit. Robin Rolfe Resources continues to use a broadcast e-mail system, which provides greater flexibility in communicating up-to-date CLE program information to our members.

Robin Rolfe Resources has provided excellent administrative services in support of the CLE program.

COMPLIANCE

The NYIPLA has moved aggressively to continue compliance with substantially expanded CLE procedures, which include new requirements as to the format and content of the Certificate of Participation, the substantiation of the registration process, and the monitoring of program attendance.

CONCLUSION

It has been our pleasure serving this year as Co-Chairs of the Continuing Legal Education Committee. We hope that the NYIPLA continues an aggressive approach to continuing legal education programs, the goal being to meet and exceed the needs of the intellectual property bar.

In addition, it would not have been possible for the Committee to achieve such successful CLE programming without the excellent support of the individual members of the Committee. These members have devoted extensive time and effort in planning programs and arranging for speakers and content. We also would like to thank all the NYIPLA Committees that co-sponsored the monthly programs and the Meeting & Forums Committee, co-chaired by Colman Ragan and Steven Lendaris, for organizing the programs.

COPYRIGHT LAW & PRACTICE

The Committee held several telephone conferences with the membership to discuss emerging issues and topics for possible CLE programs as well as possible amicus briefs. The Committee worked with the World IP Day Committee to support the NYIPLA's participation in this year's event, "Movies – A Global Passion."

The Committee has also worked to provide panelists for the Annual Meeting Workshop in conjunction with the Trademark Law & Practice Committee. The committee has engaged the expertise of academia and industry personnel to put together presentations on the state of the copyright law in the wake of the Supreme Court's decisions in *Petrella v. MGM, Inc.* and *American Broadcasting Cos. v. Aereo, Inc.* The panel will also discuss the implications of the hotly debated *Cariou v. Prince* case on fair use.

The Committee plans to continue monitoring developments in copyright law, to seek opportunities to publish informational pieces, and to work with other committees to develop CLE programs.

In mid-October 2013, the Committee held an in-person mixer to re-connect and re-invigorate continuing and prospective members. In 2014, we have held monthly conference calls to share ideas and discuss topics, including legislative reform, Supreme Court activity, *inter partes* review and proposed rules from the USPTO.

The Committee was also active in working with other committees on issues important to in-house counsel. By way of example, members of the Committee joined the Amicus Brief Committee in discussions regarding the Association's *Highmark/Octane* amicus briefs. Members of the Committee also worked with members of the Patent Law & Practice Committee in considering the USPTO's proposed rules regarding the identification of attributable patent owners, to which the Association provided comments. Both served as great opportunities to share in-house perspectives with members outside the Corporate Practice Committee. In addition, a number of Corporate Practice Committee members actively participated as panelists at NYIPLA events, including the Presidents' Forum and the Annual Meeting. We look forward to continuing our activity in the year ahead.

INTERNET & PRIVACY LAW

Scope of the Committee: To consider all aspects of internet and privacy law in the United States, and to make recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Directors.

The NYIPLA Internet & Privacy Law Committee organized a CLE Presentation for the May 21, 2013 Annual Meeting entitled, “Data Security & Risk Mitigation In Cyberspace.” The speakers were John Merchant, CyberEdge Specialist at AIG, and Anne B. Sekel, Foley & Lardner LLP. The panel explored issues unique to practicing law in the era of social media, including risks of modern communication technologies, protecting confidentiality, permissible lawyer advertising, and unintended creation of attorney-client relations through blogging, as well as risks to businesses using social media, cloud computing and other new platforms, as well as tools to ensure against such risks.

On February 18, 2014, the Committee hosted a Webinar, “What Every NY Attorney Should Know About California Privacy Law – But Is Afraid to Ask!” featuring Joanne McNabb, Director of Privacy Education and Policy in the newly created Privacy Enforcement and Protection Unit in the California Department of Justice, and one of the architects of California’s privacy requirements, especially in the mobile and internet ecospheres. Ms. McNabb fielded questions and engaged in a lively discussion with James Williams, a Vice President and Senior Privacy Officer for HSBC Technology & Services North America, and Kevin Moss of Kramer Levin Naftalis & Frankel LLP, and Chair of the Committee, on a variety of topics where California is arguably driving the conversation on privacy. The presentation began with an introduction to California’s so called “CalOPPA” statute, and then traversed various topics including breach notification, California’s expanded definition of what constitutes PII, and the recent “Privacy on the Go” initiatives directly related to mobile privacy issues, as well as California’s Digital Privacy Rights for Minors Act. The Webinar, the NYIPLA’s first, was very well attended, and garnered considerable positive reviews.

Finally, the Committee is currently working on another webinar on privacy issues arising from the use of drones by governmental and commercial entities. That webinar is scheduled to occur in the Fall of 2014.

INVENTOR OF THE YEAR (IOTY) AWARD

Scope of the Committee: To solicit, gather, and review nominations for the Inventor of the Year award, and to make recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Directors.

The 2014 Inventor of the Year Award Committee reviewed ten (10) submissions for the Inventor of the Year award this year, including one (1) resubmission from the prior year. The Committee presented its top three (3) choices to the Board for discussion and approval. The Board agreed with the Committee’s finding and decided to recognize Drs. Michel Sadelain, M.D., Ph.D., and Renier J. Brentjens, M.D, Ph.D., of the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York for their extensive work in the area of CAR T-Cell technologies, which involve taking a patient’s own T-cells and engineering them to recognize a protein that appears on the surface of cancer cells. The modified T-cells are then infused back in the patient’s bloodstream so they can launch a precise immunological attack against the cancer.

The Committee has also updated its compilation of useful FAQs on the NYIPLA website to provide information to potential nominators and candidates for the award, which we believe contributed to the Committee's receiving an increased pool of nominations. The Committee also added a notice component of its program to advise the nominating parties for each submission that they were not the winner, which resulted in some valuable feedback on the process from interested parties.

We would like to recognize all the Committee members for their excellent work researching, reviewing, and ranking the submissions this year.

We also want to thank our Board Liaison, Kevin C. Ecker, for his help navigating the process for the 2014 award.

MEETINGS & FORUMS

Scope of the Committee: To prepare and conduct a series of monthly educational meetings of the Association other than meetings of the Officers, Committees and Board of Directors, the Annual Meeting of the Association and the Annual Dinner in Honor of the Federal Judiciary, and to make recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Directors.

This year, a main focus of the Meetings & Forums Committee was to attract more members to our CLE functions by hosting events targeting different NYIPLA constituencies, including law students and younger attorneys as well as attorneys practicing outside of Manhattan. We feel that this strategy was a success and we will continue the strategy into 2014-15. Below is a brief summary of the programs our Committee hosted in 2013-14.

Over the course of the past year, the Meetings & Forums Committee and the Young Lawyers Committee jointly hosted a series of three networking events and panels aimed at creating an open dialogue with young lawyers addressing the variety of career options presented in today's changing marketplace. These events, held on July 19, 2013 at Kaye Scholer LLP, on October 10, 2013 at New York Law School, and April 2, 2014 at Fordham University School of Law, were well attended and offered a unique opportunity to introduce the NYIPLA to law students as well as attorneys in the earliest stages of their careers.

Building on the successful collaboration with the Young Lawyers Committee, the Meetings & Forums Committee teamed up with the Patent Litigation Committee on November 30, 2013, for a reception and presentation on the litigation perspectives of former law clerks from jurisdictions with heavy patent case dockets. The program was such a success that consideration is being given to hosting a series of similar events in the future.

On December 16, 2013, we held our annual CLE luncheon event featuring a member of the judiciary. This year we were pleased to host Circuit Judge Kathleen M. O'Malley of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. Judge O'Malley led a lively discussion focused primarily on her thoughts concerning recent congressional "patent reform" efforts. In particular, Judge O'Malley discussed how her views relating to the roles that the Federal Circuit and Congress play in establishing substantive and procedural law, particularly in the patent arena, have evolved since she was appointed to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Ohio in 1994. This event was well attended and many attendees were able to engage Judge O'Malley in a question-and-answer session after the formal presentation.

Our final event was held on May 1, 2014 at the Morrelly Homeland Security Center in Bethpage, New York. This was our second annual event planned in collaboration with Accelerate Long Island, the Long Island Forum for Technology ("LIFT"), and the Long Island Software and Technology Network ("LISTNet") and provided an excellent opportunity to extend the reach of the NYIPLA into the Long Island community of technology companies. This program featured three panels discussing concrete solutions for start-ups,

from initial company formation and protection of key intellectual property, through resources for funding and scale-up, to addressing issues that arise when success takes the company beyond the incubator.

In the coming year, we hope to keep this momentum going and offer programs to our members and prospective members at convenient times and venues as well as continue the outreach to our members who live and work in the areas surrounding Manhattan, such as Northern New Jersey, Long Island, and Westchester County. To this end, we are currently working with the New Jersey Intellectual Property Association to organize a joint event for Fall 2014.

MEMBERSHIP

Overall membership increased to 1352 (2013-14) vs. 1298 members (2012-13). To help encourage more corporate members, the Association Bylaws were amended in 2012 to create a “Corporate Membership.” Corporate membership is offered to members of a corporate law department at a rate of \$150 per year. The Membership Committee worked with the Corporate Practice Committee to help grow this segment of members. We have a total of 52 paid corporate members. It is also worth noting that student membership increased to 134 from 116.

The Committee continues trying to locate lapsed members and to renew those memberships where possible. The new Association website helps to minimize membership lapses; members now can update their own contact information, so it is easier for the Association to stay in touch with members as they change location/firm affiliation.

Assisted colleagues from the NYIPLA in-house Corporate Practice Committee in reviewing and preparing comments to the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office's proposed rules on attributable ownership, which requires, among other things, patent applicants and owners to regularly update patent ownership information during pendency of the patent application in the USPTO and after the patent has been granted.

Continued to review patent reform proposals in Congress and related proposed rule changes in the USPTO.

Organized a full-day CLE program at Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law on Intellectual Property Developments in China; hosted representatives from the China State Intellectual Property Office (“SIPO”), including Commissioner Tian, who is one of the leading voices in China on intellectual property matters. Commissioner Tian gave a keynote address to the meeting and emphasized China’s commitment to intellectual property issues, and its work with international organizations to enhance China’s intellectual property system. Commissioner Tian also discussed the IP5 meeting with representatives from the U.S., Japan, Europe, and Korea to discuss global IP issues.

Drafted and published articles in the NYIPLA bulletin directed to patent reform and recent USPTO developments.

Committee members participated on NYIPLA monthly CLE panels to discuss patent reform and recent USPTO developments at the Patent Trial and Appeal Board and, in cooperation with the Young Lawyers Committee, gave a presentation on reasons why it is important to obtain a USPTO registration number.

Continued to work with the USPTO, New York Volunteer Lawyers for the Arts, and IP bar associations around the country to finalize a pro bono IP assistance program for small businesses and independent inventors.

Met with and coordinated USPTO activities in New York with the USPTO designate residing in New York for one year; participated in IP presentations with the USPTO designate.

The NYIPLA Patent Litigation Committee ended the last year with a survey of its members on ways to improve the Committee, and began this year with a similar survey, both seeking ideas for activities of interest that would be appropriate for the Committee. The surveys received strong responses, and directed much of the Committee’s work this year. The first meeting was held on July 24, followed by in-person luncheons approximately every month, with strong attendance of the Committee’s 50+ members.

Committee members contributed to various CLE programs (including a presentation with the Amicus Brief Committee for the Annual Meeting), published numerous articles, monitored and commented on patent reform bills, contributed to the Association’s letters to the Senate Judiciary Committee, and monitored important Federal Circuit and Supreme Court cases.

In addition, the Committee, in conjunction with the Meetings & Forums Committee, organized and ran a successful “Former Clerk Panel,” which was well received and generated interest in additional, future panels with clerks from different jurisdictions, a project that the Committee intends to continue in the coming year.

The Publications Committee publishes the NYIPLA Bulletin on a bi-monthly basis, five times a year. The Green Booklet, published in the summer, is the annual record of the NYIPLA, replacing the former Greenbook.

The Bulletin is a journal of articles of interest to the intellectual property community written by Association members and guests. A new feature this year was a themed issue, which was published as the February/March issue and centered on Smartphones. Articles of note included a review of several *Apple v. Samsung* cases, a design patent case involving BlackBerry® devices, and protecting trademarks for mobile apps.

Articles in the other issues of the Bulletin this year covered a wide range of topics. In the beginning of the year, the Bulletin continued publishing the first and second place Hon. William C. Conner Writing Competition winners' articles, which discussed resolving trademark disputes in the fashion industry and reverse payment agreements in pharmaceutical litigation. There were a number of articles that surveyed various patent law topics, including those that examined the Patent Pilot program, patent eligibility challenges since *Bilski*, requests to stay pending *inter partes* review (IPR), and *inter partes* joinder. Throughout the year there were several other articles discussing IPR proceedings, the America Invents Act (AIA), amicus briefs filed on behalf of the NYIPLA in the Supreme Court and the Federal Circuit, and legislative efforts to change or reform the patent laws.

Many of the articles published in the Bulletin come from members of other NYIPLA Committees, such as the Patent Litigation Committee, the Patent Law & Practice Committee, the Trademark Law & Practice Committee, and the Amicus Brief Committee.

Regular features in the Bulletin include reviews of Supreme Court cases decided in last year's Term (August/September issue), previews of Supreme Court cases to be argued in this year's Term (October/November issue) and the following features that appear in each edition of the Bulletin: the President's Corner, the Historian's Corner, IP Media Links, Notable Trademark Trial and Appeal Board Decisions, reports of the Association's CLE presentations, minutes of the Board of Directors' meetings, calendar of the Association's upcoming events, New Members list, and Moving Up & Moving On – for publicizing news of members' transitions and accolades. Copies of the Bulletin were mailed to all Association members and posted on the nyipla.com website in color.

The Trademark Law & Practice Committee had 13 active members this year. The Committee has corresponded extensively and had several conference calls. The Committee also had a meet-and-greet luncheon at King and Spalding earlier this year.

The Committee is currently planning the Hot Topics in Trademark, Advertising, & Copyright CLE Seminar which will be held on July 17, 2014.

The Committee has developed a list of current topics of interest and a list of potential speakers for the program. The keynote address will be given by John Tantillo, Ph.D., the “Brand Marketing Doctor.”

The Committee has planned a CLE workshop for the NYIPLA Annual Meeting on May 20, 2014, which comprises a panel of speakers discussing recent notable Supreme Court and Federal Circuit decisions in the trademark and copyright areas.

In addition, several Committee members have contributed articles to the NYIPLA Bulletin throughout the year.

The Committee plans on working with other committees to organize an after-work function in September and conducting at least one other CLE program.

U.S. BAR - EUROPEAN PATENT OFFICE LIAISON COUNCIL

The U.S. Bar/EPO Liaison Council includes delegates from U.S. IP organizations and IP sections of state and regional bar associations having a special interest in European patent practice that has met annually with officials of the EPO, often including its president, for the last 29 years. In 2013, the U.S. delegation was invited to join in the EPO’s full-day celebration of the 40th anniversary of the signing of the European Patent Convention prior to the Council meeting in Munich on October 18, 2013.

As has occurred in the past, the EPO representatives advised the delegates, before the EPO’s public announcement, of two important changes in EPO practice which had been raised in prior Council meetings by the U.S. delegates.

U.S. BAR - JAPAN PATENT OFFICE LIAISON COUNCIL

The U.S. Bar – JPO Liaison Council is a group of delegates from U.S. IP organizations that has been meeting annually with high officials of the Japan Patent Office to discuss matters of interest to JPO users and international patent law harmonization issues.

Thirteen U.S. members of the Council met with officials of the Japan Patent Office in Tokyo on June 17, 2013. A report of that meeting has been published in the NYIPLA Bulletin and on the NYIPLA website.

Council delegates are now preparing for the annual meeting with JPO officials in Washington, D.C. on June 20, 2014.

U.S. BAR – STATE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OFFICE OF CHINA LIAISON COUNCIL

Following a very successful meeting between SIPO (State Intellectual Property Office) of China and the US Bar Liaison Council in NYC at Benjamin N. Cardozo School of Law last year, the 2014 annual SIPO/US Bar Liaison Council meeting took place on May 7th and 8th, 2014 in Beijing. On May 7th, an afternoon meeting with SIPO Leadership took place at SIPO where Articles 33, 22.3, 26.3, and 26.4 were discussed along with the draft amendment related to administrative enforcement. On May 8th, SIPO and the US Bar Liaison Council meeting took place at the Chinese Intellectual Property Training Center (CIPTC) and started with the exchange of gifts. SIPO made three (3) presentations on Chinese laws while the Council made three (3) presentations on United States law. SIPO made presentations on (1)

CN Utility Models including updates on the recent amendments, (2) Updates to recent draft amendments to the Inventor for Remuneration for Service Invention, and (3) CN Design Patent, particularly Electronic Screen Design, amendments. The U.S. Council made presentations on (1) U.S. patentable subject matter (*Alice Corp. Pty. Ltd. v. CLS Bank International* case), (2) Updates on U.S. policy and progress of anti-troll legislation, and (3) Updates on induced and direct infringement in light of *Limelight Networks, Inc. v. Akamai Technologies, Inc.* A formal report on the meeting is expected in late May. The annual SIPO/US Bar Liaison Council meeting should be held in the United States in 2015.

Hosted an Intellectual Property Delegation from China. Committee members provided presentations to the Chinese delegation on U.S. patent law; the Chinese delegation provided an update on recent IP developments in China.

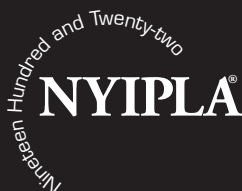

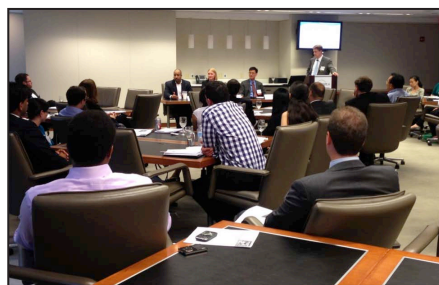

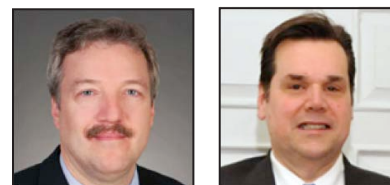
